Active Travel live public consultations

There is a lot of Active Travel work underway at the moment including formal public consultation on three large schemes

- Wellington Lane Walking and Cyclina Scheme
- Grand Canal to Lucan Urban Green-
- D24 Neighbourhood Cycle Network

These schemes alone would deliver a total of over 17Km of new and improved Walking and Cycling Infrastructure to South Dublin, taking in Schools, Sports Clubs and building significant connections for residents in these areas to have real options on short to medium journeys to walk or cycle.

Public consultation on these schemes run during September and we would encourage members of the public to make submissions during this time.

School Warden Service

South Dublin County Council operates 94 School Crossings across the County to facilitate safety for children that cycle, walk, or wheel to school.

Currently there are 106 School Wardens employed by SDCC to operate the 94 School Crossings. School Wardens have the authority to stop traffic for the crossing of children and operate during the school drop-off and pick-up, in all

If a driver fails to observe the instruction of the School Warden, they run risk of penalty points and a fine. As part of their role School Wardens will undergo refresher training and recently completed this training over four sessions in September 2022.

Residential Zoned Land

he Residential Zoned Land Tax will be a new tax on zoned undeveloped residential and certain mixed-use land and will replace the Vacant Site Levy.

It was introduced in the 2022 Budget through the Finance Act 2021 and a charge of 3% of the value of the land will be levied by the Revenue Commissioners from 2024. The tax goes to central government.

The local authority is charged with drawing up a map of the relevant lands for publication on 1st November 2022 which will be subject to public consultation until 1st January 2023.

All residentially zoned land is 'inscope' but importantly, residential properties will not be liable for the tax, with residential properties that have a curtilage larger than 0.4047 (one acre) required to register with Revenue following publication of the final map on 1st December 2023.

A communications campaign on the new tax is to issue from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage and the Finance Department prior to the publication of the draft maps. The Council will also communicate on the RZLT at a local level.

Clondalkin Local Area Plan

The Planning Department has commenced baseline work in preparation for a local area plan (LAP) for Clondalkin in line with an objective in the recently adopted County Development Plan.

The first phase is to build on existing knowledge by analysing available data and through survey work. This will be followed by public and stakeholder consultation to ensure that local and external stakeholder expertise and experience is incorporated into the plan making process.

The Plan must work within the wider planning policy and legislative context, including housing delivery, while responding to the needs of local communities. It is anticipated that a first round of informal public consultation stage will commence later in Q1 2023 with a formal draft plan then going out to formal public consultation in Q3/Q4 2023.

Sláintecare Launch

On Thursday, 6th October at Fetter-cairn Community and Youth Centre, Mayor of South Dublin - Councillor Emma Murphy together with Minister of State for Public Health, Wellbeing and National Drugs Strategy-Frank Feighan TD, launched Tallaght as a Sláintecare Healthy Community Programme area.

The programme which will see targeted supports and initiatives to improve local social determinants of health is being established across Tallaght in the catchment areas of Fettercairn, Jobstown, Killinarden, Tymon and Avonbeg.

Introduced nationally in 2021, Sláintecare Healthy Communities is a cross-Government initiative to deliver increased health and wellbeing services in nineteen areas of greatest need across Ireland.

Partners delivering the programme include the Department of Health, the Health Service Executive, South Dublin County Council, South Dublin County Partnership and several additional local statutory and voluntary stakeholders.



New Local Sports Plan

S3 Solutions LTD have been appointed to develop a new five year local sports plan for South Dublin.

Local and national stakeholders will be engaged to review the current provision and map out a sports and recreation strategy that aligns with national policy and programmes such as Sláintecare, Active Cities and Active Travel. The plan will be launched in 2023.

Mid-Term Review of South Dublin Traveller Accommodation Programme 2019-2024

n July 2022, the Department of Housing Local Government and Heritage (DHLGH) directed all local authorities to undertake a midterm review of their current Traveller Accommodation Programme (TAP). This process involved the invitation of submissions from the public and relevant agencies. Seven formal submissions were subsequently received.


The mid-term report includes:

- Updates on delivery of new and redeveloped Traveller accommodation
- Numbers of Traveller households allocated standard social housing or casual vacancies on

- existing Traveller accommodation
- Provision of caravans/mobile homes/medical chalets, and,
- Acknowledgement and responses to issues raised in submissions where appropriate

The report recommended that no formal amendment to the TAP was required and was endorsed by the Council's Housing Strategic Policy Committee. The South Dublin Local Traveller Accommodation Consultative Committee (LTACC) considered the report and highlighted the transient site provision, energy efficiency in Traveller accommodation and caravan/mobile home provision.

Following detailed consideration, the LTACC formally agreed that no formal amendment should be made to the TAP and the Council has now advised DHLGH.





Social Housing 2022

A summary of social housing assessments (SSHA) will be prepared in the coming weeks. These summaries help identify the level of social housing support needed nationwide and helps inform national housing policy.

Social housing support applicants, who have not been assessed since 3rd September 2021 will be notified to complete an online form to assess their current housing needs.

A SSHA awareness campaign will include contacting local support agencies, notice in local media, the Council's website and social media as well as on the landing page of the Choice Based Letting section of our Housing Online portal.





Local Enterprise Office September BBO **Networking Event**

The benefits of live networking have been greatly missed over the past 2 years during COV-ID and there was significant interest from our clients in our first LEO South Dublin BBO Networking event which was held at Áras Chrónáin September 1st last.

Over 80 clients attended the event which also included a presentation of certificates to 30 business promoters who recently received funding for feasibility, priming and business expansion grant support.

A wide variety of enterprises at various stages of their business development journey took full advantage to engage and explore opportunities to work together to start, grow and strengthen their business presence in South Dublin.



South Dublin County Schools Encouraged to Sign Up For Ireland's **Largest Enterprise Programme**

Schools across South Dublin County are being encouraged to sign up for this year's Student Enterprise Programme. An initiative of the Local Enterprise Offices, the country's largest enterprise programme for second level students begins its 21st year and over 300,000 students have taken part since it began.

South Dublin has had success over the years with a number of budding enterprises all over the county. Focusing on last year, South Dublin was represented at the National Final 2022 by Crazy Candles in the junior category and Scented Sanitizer representing the senior category.

Culture Night in Tallaght Cultural Quarter

Culture Night in the Cultural Quarter was a roaring success with a record number of over 1,200 people attending events on the outdoor Cultural Quarter Stage, in Rua Red, The Civic Theatre, The Big Picture, and Tallaght Library.

Audiences were treated to a number of family friendly activities in Tallaght Library and The Civic, as well as a programme that included world class music, dance, and visual arts.

Late night events featured for the first time with leading DJ's pumping out sounds from the Cafés in Rua Red and the Civic. Events included Breaking Codes by Go Dance for Change featuring the NOISE Music Collective: the Sub Sounds Collective; The Tower by Jesse Jones; Junk

Ensemble in conversation; Songs of Change by The Civic on the big screen in Library Square; and the wonderful site-specific performance "As If By Chance" by Tallaght Community Arts.

Elsewhere, people rocked up in Lucan to hear Riptide Movement perform in their home town, Tallaght Choral Society performed in Tallaght Theatre, there was Trad music in Áras Chrónáin and live performance and tours at heritage sites in the county, as well as children's and family friendly events in libraries across the county.




You're the Business event at Google HQ, Dublin

In order to fulfil this function, we take diversity, intergenerational families and intersectionality (how social identities such as gender, race, ethnicity, social class, religion, sexual orientation, ability, and gender identity overlap with one another), into account. Using a universal design approach enables us to provide for the diverse needs of the people of the County.

During her presentation, Disability Liaison, Access and Equality Officer, Selina Bonnie will share examples from our public buildings, changing places facilities and playspaces to demonstrate how we implement a universal design approach across our buildings and facilities.

Tymon Park Wins 2022/23 Pollinator Award for the Best Town Park in Ireland

outh Dublin County Council are delighted to announce that Tymon Park has won the prestigious 2022/23 Pollinator Award for the Best Town Park in Ireland as part of the Green Flag scheme. The award assesses the pollinator-friendly management of parks against the recommendations of the All-Ireland Pollinator Plan.

Over the past number of years SDCC have greatly increased the number of natural meadows in parks and open spaces across the county including in Tymon Park. Presently Tymon Park has over 100 acres of long flowering meadows with 395 acres county wide.

As well as managing the meadows and carrying out survey work to ensure the management is effective, the Council

has been communicating this work to the public using videos highlighting the work that is being undertaken and the importance of these actions. All of the staff involved are delighted to have their hard work recognised with this major national award.

In addition to this SDCC has been awarded five Green Flag Awards for Waterstown Park, Sean Walsh Park, Tymon Park, Corkagh Park and Rathfarnham Castle Park.

The Green Flag Award scheme aims to encourage the provision of good quality public parks and green spaces that are managed in environmentally sustainable ways. The Council would like to also acknowledge the many community volunteers and residents' groups who play an active role in parks around the county and whose hard work and dedication contributed to these awards.



Mattress Recycling

What happens to a deconstructed mattress?
- Polyurethane Foam is recycled into various products such as carpet underlay

- Steel Springs are repurposed into various metal products
- Cotton Padding is reused in furniture manufacturing - Synthetic fibres can be granulated and reformed into polyester chips for conversion into thread
- 10% of residual wastes due to soiling or excessive moisture used as fuel in waste to energy process

Dublin Climate Action Week 2022

Bulbs not Bonfires!

Bulbs not Bonfires is a reward provided through South Dublin County Council's Social Credit Scheme. Every year we encourage residents of the county to look after their environment at Halloween by providing communities with bulbs to plant for spring flowers instead of a scarred open space as the result of a bonfire. Community groups, environmental groups, resident associations, and schools can apply.

We have also announced we will be giving out 300 bags of mixed pollinator bulbs, including Crocus, Muscari, Alliums, Snowdrops & Daffodils. To receive bulbs, groups are asked to fill out our simple application form and attach a photo to let us know where the bulbs are to be planted. Hundreds of old Mattresses collected for Recycling

South Dublin County Council's Waste Enforcement & Licensing Section has partnered with local social enterprise **Recycle IT**, based in Clondalkin, to divert old used mattresses away from the waste stream back into the circular economy free of charge.

Each year South Dublin County Council holds 6 community collection days and invites members of the public to drop off their old mattress. These are collected and delivered to **Eco Mattress Recycling Ireland Limited** who deconstruct the mattresses for repurposing.

Collections have been held in Lucan, Rathcoole, Tallaght and North Clondalkin. With 2 collection days still to come.



Funded by South Dublin County Council, approximately €11.5 million is currently being invested in the expansion of Tallaght Stadium, which is the only municipal stadium of its kind in Ireland. A new North Stand, which is under construction, will increase the overall capacity to 10,000+ and will further cement its position as a top-class arena which consistently hosts elite sporting events. The sod-turning for the new North Stand took place in June and the facility is due to be completed by July 2023.

The new development will cement Tallaght Stadium's UEFA Category 4 status, allowing for the hosting of all UEFA competitive fixtures, including Internationals, UEFA Champions League, UEFA Europa League and UEFA Europa Conference League games. The stand has been architecturally designed to the highest possible standard with the under croft containing new commercial units, part of which Shamrock Rovers will occupy. With stadium seating and temporary on-field seating, the venue could accom-


modate up to 20,000 people and therefore South Dublin County Council also intends to use the stadium as a major concert and event centre, with the intention to host the first large-scale concert over the next 18 months.

As well as the new North Stand, major refurbishment work is also taking place across the West Stand corporate areas to provide revamped conference and meeting room facilities, as well as enhanced amenities for media and sporting fixtures. Improvements are also being made to the Accessible Seating areas in the South Stand, while a changing places facility is also being installed.

The delivery of the North Stand at Tallaght Stadium forms part of the current investment of over €80 million by the Council in a range of infrastructure projects underway in Tallaght, such as the delivery of a new Heritage Centre, the Tallaght Innovation Centre, now under construction, the Tallaght District Heating Scheme, as well as a major public realm enhancement programme for Tallaght Town Centre.







Works to commence on a series of ambitious projects which will transform the public realm of Tallaght Town Centre

n 2019 SDCC secured Urban Regeneration Funding from the Department for Housing, Planning and Local Government to deliver a series of enhancement projects across the Tallaght Town Centre. This included the planned delivery of a network of public realm improvements including a new mobility interchange, new pedestrian links and plaza upgrades, as well as a new public plaza. Following approval of a Part 8 planning application, these projects are now ready for delivery and works will commence on site in the coming weeks.


These ambitious projects will transform the public realm of the Tallaght Town Centre. Totalling approximately 1.2ha of land the works include the brand-new Innovation Square within Cookstown that will provide a new public amenity space immediately outside the Councils proposed new Innovation workspace building

As well as a new pedestrian link connecting Innovation Square across the existing Belgard Square North Road, along the eastern edge of the Council building into a revamped Chamber Square and ultimately on to the new mobility interchange and public square adjacent to the existing Tallaght Luas stop and the future proposed Bus Connects interchange, along with an improved public space in front of Rua Red Arts Centre and The Civic Theatre.

Clonmel Enterprises is the main contractor shortly and it is anticipated with construction due to commence in early October 2022. The overall scheme will be completed in the summer of 2024.

During construction there will have to be some restrictions place on how the Council building and Library can be accessed. These arrangements will vary over the life of the project, but we will endeavour to keep staff, Councillors and the public fully informed of this throughout.




