



Thanks Annette for this I was most impressed by the beautiful art work the kids are working on and their huge enthusiasm in their work. No better way to engage young people in community activities. The survey component is significant as, not only does it solicit useful information but it also helps to engage local communities, raise awreness of youth work and issues related to Graffitti. They obviously designed the survey based on their objectives, but I would like to suggest some more questions. For example do people feel there is adequate protection measures for the community, what prevention measures should be put in palce etc. This may not be for now, but going forward it may be important for communities to come up with ways of tackling Graffitti both as a vandalism and art issue. I am heartened by your proactive approach in tackling it from a positive perspective because for me that is the main way of preventing the young people themselves nd also the community.
