Gum Litter Task Force

2017 - Gum litter task force was launched by the Deputy Mayor Cllr Martina Genockey, Clondalkin Tidy Towns and St Josephs BNS. The campaign has had huge success to date in changing the public's behaviour to gum disposal and in encouraging correct gum disposal through a targeted education awareness campaign. According to research carried out by Millward Brown on behalf of the Gum Litter Taskforce (GLT) during the 2016 campaign, the highest number of people to date (93%) agree that dropping gum is littering and almost six in seven people (84%) claiming they always dispose of their gum correctly.



Good News - Throughout the year groups within SDCC have been extremely active in their communities keeping them clean, graffiti free and with green space enhancement through the Bulbs not bonfires campaign. Materials and support are available to all groups that make an application through the Social Credit System. Below is an example of some of the great work that's been carried out by residents from all around SDCC.
