OPRAH Older People Remaining at Home

OPRAH is a project that is aimed at supporting older adults to remain living in their own homes and communities by reducing repeated hospital admissions and early entry to long term nursing home care. During our Age Friendly County consultation process we spoke with over 500 older people living in South Dublin and we received a strong message, older people want to stay living in their own homes as long as possible. In many cases all that is required are small changes in order to make this happen. Older people may need help to deal with issues such as loneliness, isolation and anxiety about personal security. They may require adaptations to make their home accessible or they may need help with meals or personal care. The OPRAH Coordinator is available to meet with older people and their families to assess their individual needs and to put a plan in place. The coordinator will provide links to a range of supports and services to support the older person to continue to live safely and securely in their own home.

South Dublin Age Friendly Ambassadors



The first South Dublin Age Friendly Ambassadors were presented with their Ambassador badges in April 2014. Their mission is to ensure that older people who may be at risk of loneliness and isolation are informed about the different social opportunities that are available. The Ambassadors have been working all across South Dublin County and have been involved in setting up new groups, and organising and promoting events and activities. Over the last 8 weeks the Ambassadors took part in a series of training seminars to help them develop the skills and

knowledge they need for their role. The seminars were a great success, and each Ambassador received a certificate of attendance on the final day. The certificates were presented by Cllr. Mick Duff who expressed his appreciation for the work being carried out by the Ambassadors.




GET INVOLVED TELL US YOUR IDEAS



Age Friendly Business Recognition Scheme

Are you a business owner in South Dublin County? You might be interested in the following facts:

- Older people own 75% of the wealth in the EU and account for 50% of consumer spending.
- Older customers (65+) in Ireland have a revenue declared annual income of over €6.5 billion.
- Older consumers will double in number in the next 30 years, and those over 80 will quadruple.
- Older people are loyal customers and outspend younger shoppers.
- Older customers not only spend locally and have a lot of purchasing power, but also have the time to shop.
- 50% of all toys are bought by grandparents.
- Over 50's take on average almost three trips a year in Ireland, staying three nights away.

By joining the Age Friendly Business Recognition scheme you can get an Age Friendly logo to identify yourself as an age friendly business and publicise your business locally and nationally. The recognition process involves training sessions, a tool kit and support on how to better meet the needs of older adults and in turn, increase your business.
