#### **Items discussed**

# 1. Removal of Shrubbery along pathway (from Templeroan roundabout towards Ballyboden roundabout)

The group acknowledged that the Council had trimmed the bushes on the roadside at this location which has improved the area a little, however, the footpath/cycle lane side is still overgrown. This creates a walkway that is badly lit and unsafe for users
