# My Visit to South Dublin County Council's County Hall

This guide will help me know what to expect when visiting South Dublin County Council's County Hall.

#### What is County Hall?

County Hall is where South Dublin County Council staff work. It has offices, meeting spaces, and a café. People visit County Hall for different reasons. I might come here to:

- Meet a staff member about housing, a local park, or another issue.
- Meet a Councillor (a local political representative),
- Or to visit the café.

### Where is County Hall?

County Hall is in the centre of Tallaght, beside Tallaght Library and The Square shopping centre.

The address is: County Hall, Tallaght, Dublin 24, D24 A3XC.


### How I can travel to County Hall

I can travel to County Hall by public transport or car.

**Bus routes:** 27, S6, and 132 stop nearby along with others.

**Luas:** Take the Red Line from Connolly Station to The Square, Tallaght.

**Driving:** Exit the M50 at Tallaght and follow signs for County Hall.

# Accessible and Age Friendly Parking

There is a car park in front of County Hall. Parking is first come, first served. Some areas are reserved for staff or Councillors and may be blocked off with a cone. This means I can't park there.

- There are 8 accessible parking spaces for disabled people. I need a Disabled Person's Parking Permit to park here.
- There are 2 Age Friendly spaces.
- Security staff in the car park can show me where to park.
- I can also park in The Square shopping centre, a 5-minute walk from County Hall.

## County Hall Entrances

County Hall has two entrances:

- The main entrance beside County Library.
- The side entrance beside the car park.

**If I enter** through the side entrance, the reception desk is straight ahead.

**If I enter** through the main entrance, I will see the stairs, and the reception desk is to my right.

**If I am unsure** where to go, I can ask the person at the reception desk for help.

# Meeting Someone at County Hall

I can meet someone in:

- The café
- The seating area behind the lift
- A quieter pod beside the stairs

If I am unsure where to wait, I can ask reception. They can call the person I am meeting.





# Getting Food or a Drink

To get to the café from reception, I:

- Walk past the stairs and the main entrance doors.
- Turn left.

At the counter, I can order food or a drink. The café can be busy and noisy at lunchtime.






### Leaving a Meeting

I can leave my meeting at any time. I can use the exit buttons to open the doors myself, or I can ask a staff member to show me the way out.

Most meetings happen downstairs, but some may be in meeting rooms upstairs. Rooms might look like these in the pictures.



### **Getting Around the Building**

I can use the stairs or the lift to get around the building. Both are near the main entrance and reception area. If I need help finding my way, I can ask a staff member.

#### **Toilets**

There are toilets on the ground floor near the café and staff canteen.

There is also an accessible toilet on every floor.

A staff member can show me where the nearest toilet is.

#### If I Feel Overwhelmed

If I feel overwhelmed, I can:

- Move around or stim.
- Leave the room or go outside.
- Visit the library's <u>Sensory Cubbie</u> (more information is available on their website).
- I do not need to ask for permission to leave.


### **Sensory Environment**

County Hall can sometimes be busy, especially near the reception and café. There may be groups of people talking downstairs, which can make the area feel busy and loud.



### **COUNTY HALL**SENSORY MAP - SECOND FLOOR




