WRITER IN RESIDENCE

The Red Line Festival Writer-in-Residence for 2022 is Dublin rapper Selló. Championing a new voice for the nation of Ireland in the form of "Gaelic Drill", a fusion of traditional Irish culture with the modern drill/ hip hop sound. Selló has pioneered a new era of music that is heavily focused on reviving classic samples and giving them a new lease of life.

As part of his residency, Selló will lead a four-week course- free and open to rappers aged between 16 and 25. He will be working in partnership with NOISE Music to help develop the skills of a new generation of Irish rappers and performers. This course will end with Writer in Residence: Sello & Guests, an opportunity to see these emerging artists perform alongside some of Ireland's most highly regarded Hip Hop artists on Friday 14th October at The Civic in Tallaght.

Selló will be working alongside artists Julia Louise Knifefist and Talkgick to make this a must for all aspiring rap artists.

Join Michael Harding as he talks about the power of connection and the importance of saying the things you need to say, before it's too late. Recovering from surgery, Michael travelled to the coast of Donegal to heal in solitude, with the comfort of the ocean around him. As he recuperated, he set himself the task of writing letters to people who had a profound effect on him through his life: old loves, mentors, friends.

The result is a collection of insights into life, death, friendship and love. These letters, expressing an intimacy not previously risked, were never posted. All the Things Left Unsaid is the startlingly honest and moving witness to the power of connection and the importance of saying the things you need to say, before it's too late.

Michael Harding is an author and playwright. His creative chronicle of ordinary life in the Irish midlands is published as a weekly column in The Irish Times.

In 2014 a brilliant Oxford graduate, Dr Ruja Ignatova, promised to revolutionise money and make people rich in the process. The future, she said, belonged to cryptocurrencies such as Bitcoin. The self-styled cryptoqueen vowed that she had invented the Bitcoin Killer. launched OneCoin, and by 2017, billions of dollars had been invested in hundreds of countries. But by the end of the year she had disappeared, along with the money, and it slowly became clear that her revolutionary cryptocurrency was not all it seemed. The Missing Cryptoqueen tells the unbelievable story of the rise, disappearance and fall of Dr Ruja Ignatova. It is a modern tale of intrigue, techno-hype and herd madness that reveals how OneCoin became the biggest scam of the 21st Century.

Jamie Bartlett is an author and presenter whose interest is the relationship between technology, politics and society and he aims to make writing on tech accessible to the general public.
